FEARS HER SON WAS KIDNAPED. Mrs. Simmons Asks Police Aid in Finding Child, Aged 9. MISSING SINCE THURSDAY.

Companions Tell of Stranger Accosting Boy in the Street. WHILE ON HIS WAY TO SCHOOL. Stranger, Mrs. Simmons Says, Answers Description of Her Husband, Whom She Has Not Seen Since March 13.

Mystery surrounds the disappearance of Richard Simmons, the 9-year-old son of Mrs. Peter Simmons, of No. 903 East Fayette street, who has been gone from home since 8 o'clock Thursday morning and who is feared by his mother to have been kidnaped.

"I saw my husband's father, Richard Simmons, at W. E. McKeever's saloon, where he is employed, and he said that when my husband went away he had remarked that he would return in a short time and when he came back it would be for something."

WATERFIELD ORDERED TO MOVE FROM HOUSE. HOME OF ALBERT E. WATERFIELD. Former Clerk of Solway Must Vacate by June 18 Home He Transferred to Village in Part Settlement of Shortage Which Occurred While He Held Office.

The property was mortgaged in the village's favor and a deed, transferring it to the village, was drawn up as part settlement of a deficiency of \$4,000 that occurred during the clerkship of Mr. Waterfield.

SCANLON CASE GIVEN JURY; SEALED VERDICT ON MONDAY. Evidence in Action Against New York Central for Death of Engineer Closed—Settlement in Arnold Suit Against City for \$1,325.

The Scanlon negligence action was given to the jury yesterday afternoon by Justice P. C. J. De Angelis in the Trial Term of the Supreme Court, and a sealed verdict was ordered returned Monday morning. The suit is against the New York Central Railroad Company and is brought by Mrs. Elizabeth T. Scanlon, as administratrix, to recover for the death of her husband, Engineer John Scanlon, who was killed near St. Johnsville.
